



## PERMIT POLICY MANUAL

### SUBJECT: **Temporary Registration (IRP/FRP)**

POLICY NUMBER: 4.09

---

**Intent:** To permit vehicles from other jurisdictions and which are not registered under the International Registration Plan (IRP)/Full Reciprocity Plan (FRP).

---

#### **General Information:**

- Does not apply to the City of Winnipeg and/or Brandon. Only a permit from the Province of Manitoba is required.
- Carriers are required to register their vehicle (s) if the vehicle travel into two (2) or more IRP member jurisdictions and is used to transport passengers for hire, or is used primarily for the transport of property and meets the following criteria:
  - Two (2) or more axles and a gross weight or registered gross weight exceeding 11,797 kgs (26,000 lbs).
  - Power units having three (3) or more axles, regardless of weight.
  - If used in combination, when the gross vehicle weight of the combination exceeds 11,797 kgs (26,000 lbs).
  - Has a regular bus route or is a chartered bus service
- Except for regular route buses, fees are based on the weight of the load (tonnes) multiplied by the number of kilometres being travelled in Manitoba multiplied by 0.009 or \$6.00, whichever is greater.
- Fees for regular route buses are based on the number of passengers multiplied by the number of kilometres being travelled in Manitoba multiplied by 0.00083 or \$6.00, whichever is greater.

#### **Exempt Vehicles:**

- The following vehicles are exempt from IRP registration:
  - Commercial vehicles operating solely within the Province of Manitoba.
  - Unladen vehicles.
  - Recreational vehicles used for personal pleasure or travel by an individual or family.
  - Government owned vehicles.
  - Commercial vehicles displaying restrictive plates which have geographic area, distance or commodity restrictions.
  - Any farm plated vehicle.
  - Any Saskatchewan registered vehicle operating within a 16 km radius of the Saskatchewan Border.
