

## PERMIT POLICY MANUAL


### SUBJECT: **Forklift Attachments**

POLICY NUMBER: 4.18

**Intent:** A permit is required for vehicles that require a forklift attachment (spider) when exceeding legal length as per Manitoba Regulation 155/2018.

#### General Information:

- This policy does not apply to vehicles operating under the former Non-RTAC regulations in Manitoba Regulation 575/88 (repealed February 2019). Refer to Policy 4.18.1 for Non-RTAC vehicles.
- The forklift attachment must be mounted on the vehicle. If the loader is not mounted, the vehicle must conform to all legal dimensions as prescribed in Manitoba Regulation 155/2018.
- Valid for trucks and truck tractor trailer/semitrailer combinations when a forklift attachment is mounted at the back of the vehicle. An allowance of 1.5 metres at the rear of the vehicle is permitted.
- Must adhere to all other federal/provincial standards, regulations and policies including Vehicle Equipment, Safety and Inspection regulations and Cargo Securement.





### Maximum Dimensions:

Unless otherwise noted, all dimensions must be in accordance to the *Vehicle Weights and Dimensions on Classes of Highway Regulation 155/2018*.

#### Straight Trucks (including single steer – tridem drive units)

Maximum overall length up to 14 m (from 12.5 m legal allowable limit)
Maximum effective overhang up to 5.0 m, including spider/loader (up from 4 m legal allowable limit)

#### Truck Tractor Semitrailer

Maximum overall length up to 24.5 m (from 23.0 m legal allowable limit)
Maximum box length up to 17.7 m (from 16.2 m legal allowable limit)
The forklift attachment shall not be included in the measurement of the effective rear overhang. Effective rear overhang cannot exceed 35% of the trailer wheelbase.

#### Truck Tractor B-Train Combination

Maximum overall length up to 27.5 m
Maximum box length up to 21.5 m (from 20.0 m legal allowable limit)
The forklift attachment shall not be included in the measurement of the effective rear overhang. Effective rear overhang cannot exceed 35% of the trailer wheelbase.

### Annual permits:

An annual Overdimensional (blanket permit) are available for the operation of these vehicles.
